IT'S MY PLACE



In the last couple of years Scotland has experienced a great number of Polish nationals coming to live and work in the country. Since new migrants represent a big part of country population it is important to support their successful integration, facilitate cultural exchange and wider Polish-Scottish cooperation.

'It's my Place' is a project that addresses this issue, by bringing together professional artists from Poland and Scotland in a community based art projects. The invited artists and art students run a number of workshops and master classes to engage the members of communities from regeneration areas in Edinburgh and transforming their experiences of place into works of art.
